- HSB 523 Consumer Credit Code Fees. Increases registration fees paid to the Attorney General by makers of consumer credit loans from \$10 to \$20 and for debt collectors from \$10 to \$100. All revenue goes to a special fund to cover enforcement costs. (House Calendar)
- HF 430 Condominium Meetings. Requires meetings to be open to all members with notice either mailed or delivered seven days in advance or posted 48 hours in advance. (House Calendar) (Companion to Local Government bill SF 2224, on Senate Calendar)
- HF 2062 Residential Sprinkler Systems. Requires city councils and county boards of supervisors that adopt a building code to take a separate vote on any provision requiring sprinkler systems in one or two-family homes or buildings under five units. (House Calendar)
- HF 2075 Coverage of Cancer Trial Routine Care. Requires health insurers to continue to cover routine care for participants in cancer trials. (Passed House; on Senate Calendar)
- HF 2111 Unemployment Tax Collection. Requires Secretary of State to notify the Department of Workforce Development prior to approving a filing for reinstatement by a dissolved company, to ensure any back taxes are paid. (Passed House; in Senate Commerce)
- HF 2112 Auto Insurance Glass Repair. Prohibits certain actions by insurers to steer customers toward particular glass repair shops. Also requires Insurance Commissioner to coordinate study of glass repair industry and its procedures. (House Calendar)
- HF 2131 Truth In Lending Act (FTLA). Updates Iowa Consumer Credit Code references to the FTLA from the Act as amended through January 1, 2008, to the Act as amended through July 1, 2010. (Signed by Governor; effective May 1, 2010)
- HF 2166 Winter Propane Delivery. Requires winter delivery to any LIHEAP eligible customer who has a \$500 cash payment, with 75% for new fuel and 25% for any outstanding bill. (House Calendar) (Similar to State Government bill SF 2235 on Senate Calendar)
- HF 2181 Financial Literacy Program. Establishes the program in the State Treasurer's Office to promote advantages of personal savings, make presentations to schools and groups, and create incentives and awards to recognize those who make progress. (House Calendar)
- HF 2229 Dental Insurance (Delta Dental Bill). Prohibits dental plan of fee schedules for the provision of dental services that are not covered by the plan. (House Calendar)
- HF 2399 Nuclear Power Plants. Makes electric generation source diversity a public policy and allows the Iowa Utilities Board to help utilities plan for future generation needs. (House Calendar) (Companion to Environment & Energy bill SSB 3204, on Senate Calendar)
- HF 2405 Broadband Grants. Allows proprietary information in grant applications to the Iowa Broadband Deployment Governance Board to remain confidential. (House Calendar)
- HF 2409 IFA Paperwork Reduction. Repeals Iowa Finance Authority requirement that banks file a paper report, as data is available online. (House Calendar)

- HF 2410 Anti-Epilepsy Drugs. Requires pharmacists to notify the subscribing physician if they substitute anti-epilepsy drugs. (House Calendar)
- HF 2411 Municipal Utilities. Cleanup of statutes that allow municipal utilities to enter into agreements with other entities to jointly finance generation or transmission facilities. (House Calendar) (Companion to Environment & Energy Bill SF 2182 on Senate Calendar)
- HF 2412 Banking Division Bill. Omnibus bill makes various noncontroversial changes in matters under the purview of the Banking Division. (House Calendar) (Companion to SF 2191, on Senate Calendar)
- SSB 3080 Cemetery and Funeral Merchandise. Among changes, starting 7-1-10, sellers must deposit 100%, rather than 80%, of money for services and products into a trust fund. Agreements made prior to 7-1-10 must still carry a \$50,000 bond. (Senate Calendar).
- SSB 3102 Auto Insurance Under/Uninsured Coverage. Prohibits step-down provisions that reduce coverage if injury occurs in a vehicle operated by a relative. Also, insurers must make available the same coverage limits as offered for bodily injury liability. (Senate Calendar)
- SSB 3155 Real Estate Closing Agent Licensing. Division of Banking bill that requires licensing of providers of real estate closing services that are neither the lender, seller, purchaser, or borrower. (Senate Calendar)
- SSB 3167 Real Estate Brokers and Salespersons. Modifies licensing disciplinary provisions to clarify the distinction between provisions relating to initial licensure and those relating to suspension or revocation of the already licensed. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 1 Coverage of Autism Syndrome. Requires health insurers to cover assessment and treatment of autism syndrome disorders for children age 20 and under. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2073 Banking Division Licensing Boards. Makes changes to the Accountancy, Engineering and Land Surveying, Architectural, Landscape Architectural, Interior Design, and Real Estate Appraiser boards, and the Real Estate Commission. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2075 Use of Credit Reports by Insurers. Requires exceptions to the use of credit reports by insurers to set rate and offer policies for those whose credit information was influenced by specified extraordinary life circumstances. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2089 Fake Music Groups. Prohibits advertising for or performances as a group without an affiliation with or permission of the actual recording group, or if it includes a former member of the actual performing group. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2108 Auto Repair Shop Artisan Liens. Creates an exception to a repair shop's ability to hold a vehicle to force payment of a disputed bill, if the Attorney General decides that the shop violated the auto trade practices law. (Sent to Governor)
- SF 2113 Statewide Cable/Video Franchises. Among changes, requires an applicant for a franchise to provide the date it will commence operation and to provide updates to the Iowa Utilities Board documenting its progress. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2154 Native Distilled Spirits (Templeton Rye Bill). Allows native distillers to conduct on-site tasting events and limited on-site retail sales. The distiller shall pay a 50% excise tax on each proof gallon sold on site. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2157 Real Estate Installment Sales. Requires real estate installment sales contracts that now must be recorded in 180 days to be recorded within 90 days and those that must now be recorded in 90 days to be recorded within 45 days. (Senate Calendar)

- SF 2191 Banking Division Bill. Omnibus bill making various noncontroversial changes in matters under the purview of the Banking Division. (Senate Calendar) (Companion to HF 2412 on House Calendar)
- SF 2192 Real Estate Transfer Fee Covenants. States that a transfer fee covenant does not run with the title and is not binding on or enforceable against a subsequent owner. Also, a lien to secure payment of a transfer fee on or after 7-1-10 is void. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2201 Insurance Division Bill. Omnibus bill makes various noncontroversial changes in matters under the purview of the Insurance Division. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2272 Insurance Guarantee Associations. Insurance Division bill making various changes to expand coverage under the Iowa Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Association and the Iowa Insurance Guaranty Association. (Senate Calendar)

- HF 2040 Allows school districts flexibility in how they use their PPEL funds. The expanded uses, as outline in the bill, can be funded only with the board approved 33 1/3 cent levy. Since school districts co-mingle the board approved levy with the voter approved levy, the bill outlines how to figure what portion of the fund can be used. - HF 2185 Requires the Department of Education and Area Education Agencies (AEA) to conduct a study of the opportunities for recruiting racial and ethnic minority teachers from outside the state. The study is to examine the impact of requiring racial and ethnic minority teachers in communities whose population is less than five percent racial and ethnic minority citizens and communities whose population is greater than five percent. The report is due to the General Assembly by January 10, 2011. (House Calendar)
- HF 2295 Requires the Department of Education to convene a task force to conduct a study of the current system of area education agencies. Membership of the task force is education stakeholders and consumers. A report is due to the General Assembly by December 15, 2010. (House Calendar)
- HF 2413 Directs school boards to prioritize resources for the purposes of extending the school calendar or the instructional hours in a school day. (House Calendar)
- HSB 620 Allows school districts to establish market factor teacher incentives using an appropriate revenue source. (House Calendar)
- HSB 623 This is a technical Code cleanup bill from the Department of Education. The bill makes corrections and updates Code language. (House Calendar) (same as SF 2288 on Senate Calendar)
- HSB 624 Updates the Code to address special education services and makes changes to align Iowa Code with federal law. (House Calendar) (same as SF 2291 on Senate Calendar)
- HSB 671 Directs school business managers, hired on or after July 1, 2010, to complete a training program related to the financial operations of a school district. Upon meeting certain requirements, individuals employed as a school business manager as of July 1, 2012, will be issued an initial authorization by the board, but are required to take continuing education courses. (House Calendar)
- SF 2178 Expands the definition of textbooks to include laptop computers or other portable personal computing devices that state funds allocated to school districts for textbooks available to accredited nonpublic school pupils. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2287 Exempts private college preparatory schools from the state's educational standards and accreditation process. (Senate Calendar)

- SF 2288 This is a technical Code cleanup bill from the Department of Education. The bill makes corrections and updates Code language. (Senate Calendar) (same as HSB 623 on House Calendar)
- SF 2289 Allows the director of the Department of Education to order the positive fund balances held by a deaccredited school district to be transferred to the school's general fund if the general fund has a negative balance. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2290 Allows school districts flexibility in how they use their PPEL funds. The expanded uses, as outline in the bill, can be funded only with the board approved 33 1/3 cent levy. Since school districts co-mingle the board approved levy with the voter approved levy, the bill outlines how to figure what portion of the fund can be used. (Senate Calendar) (same as HF 2040 on House Calendar)
- SF 2291 Updates the Code to address special education services and makes changes to align Iowa Code with federal law. (Senate Calendar) (similar to HSB 624 on House Calendar)

- HF 2030 Requires school districts to spend down their cash reserve funds before coming to the School Budget Review Committee to levy for modified allowable growth which could increase property taxes. (Signed by Governor; effective January 20, 2010)
- SF 2033 **Race to the Top.** This bill changes Iowa Code, where necessary, in order to allow Iowa to apply for federal Race to the Top funds. (Signed by Governor; effective July 1, 2010)
- SF 2045 Delays setting the state percent of growth by the Legislature to schools for one year until 2011. (Signed by Governor; effective January 20, 2010)
- SF 2046 Delays setting the categorical state percent by the Legislature of growth for one year until 2011. (Signed by Governor; effective January 20, 2010)

- SF 2196 Makes changes to certain election laws administered by the secretary of state. (Senate Calendar) (same as HSB 667 on House Calendar)
- SF 2214 Authorizes sports betting conducted on a gambling boat, gambling structure, or racetrack licensed for table games. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2215 Prohibits a person from obtaining genetic information or samples for genetic testing from an individual without first obtaining that person's informed written consent. Exceptions are made in the bill. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2217 Allows raffle tickets to be purchased using a credit or debit card. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2218 Eliminates double election boards and requires the commissioner of election, upon receipt of a petition, to use automatic tabulating equipment in certain elections. (Senate Calendar)

- SF 2235 Prohibits a propane, or other fuel vendor from withholding the delivery of fuel between November 1 and April 1 of each year if the customer meets certain criteria. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2247 Changes the class title designation of a “gaming enforcement officer.” The change is for the official designation only and does not create or modify the existing job classification or duties. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2262 Requires licensing of naturopathic physicians and establishes educational and testing requirements as a condition of licensure. The bill in place provisions for transitional licensure. (Senate Calendar)
- SSB 3066 Technical clean up bill revising apprenticeship requirements, eliminates references to four-year apprenticeship, and requires completion of a fire protection apprenticeship program approved by the U.S. Department of Labor, or completion of two years of full-time employment as a trainee. (Senate Calendar) (same as HSB 564 on House Calendar)

- HF 2156 Current law allows for commercial motor trucks to be exempt from the fee for new registration if at least 25% of the truck's miles are out of state. The bill specifies that the Department of Revenue can only go back three years from the date of the audit, rather than looking at the first four years of the truck's operation. (House Calendar)
- HF 2379 Does not allow a motor vehicle manufacturer, distributor, or importer to reduce the amount of compensation, or to disallow the claim for warranty work done by the dealer, if the paperwork is submitted within 60 days from the date that the work was completed. (House Calendar) (Similar to SF 2146)
- HSB 614 Does not allow motor vehicle franchise contracts to apply laws from other jurisdictions to Iowa's auto dealers, and states that the contracts cannot require a dealer to offer only one make of autos. (House Calendar) (Similar to SF 2234)
- HSB 616 Makes changes to the graduated driver's license program (GDL) to state that the instruction permit must be held for 12 months, instead of current 6 months. Limits the number of unrelated minor passengers to one for persons with an intermediate license and a school license. (House Calendar) (Similar to SF 2150)
- HSB 617 Expands the definitions of ATVs to include off-road utility vehicles, and allows operation on all roads where ATVs are currently allowed by local governments. Authorizes local governments to expand current designated routes to allow for stops at convenience stores and service stations. Exempts cities and counties from liability. (House Calendar)
- HSB 678 Does not allow certain indemnity clauses in motor carrier contracts which holds one of the parties harmless, regardless of their actions or omissions. (House Calendar) (Similar to SF 2220)
- HSB 695 Brings all vehicles that have been modified to accommodate persons with a disability under the \$60 registration fee. Specifies that the definition of business trade trucks applies to model year 2010 and newer trucks. Allows for parents to get a persons with disability placard for a child under the age of one without supplying a social security number. (House Calendar) (Similar to SF 2145 and SF 2246 on Senate Calendar)
- SF 2145 Brings all multipurpose vehicle registration, regardless of model year, under the weight and list price formula, and brings all vehicles that have been modified to accommodate

- persons with a disability under the \$60 registration fee. (Senate Calendar) (Similar to HSB 695 on House Calendar)
- SF 2146 Does not allow a motor vehicle manufacturer, distributor, or importer to reduce the amount of compensation, or to disallow the claim for warranty work done by the dealer, if the paperwork is submitted within 60 days from the date that the work was completed. (Senate Calendar) (Similar to HF 2379)
- SF 2150 Makes changes to the graduated driver's license program (GDL) to state that the instruction permit must be held for 12 months, instead of current 6 months. Limits the number of unrelated minor passengers to one for persons with an intermediate license and a school license. (Senate Calendar) (Similar to HSB 616)
- SF 2179 Requires all persons under the age of 18 years to use a seat belt. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2188 Allows for a temporary exemption for axle weight limitations when a retractable axle is raised in order to make a turn. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2220 Does not allow certain indemnity clauses in motor carrier contracts which holds one of the parties harmless, regardless of their actions or omissions. (Senate Calendar) (Similar to HSB 678)
- SF 2234 Does not allow motor vehicle franchise contracts to apply laws from other jurisdictions to Iowa's auto dealers, and states that the contracts cannot require a dealer to offer only one make of autos. (Senate Calendar) (Similar to HSB 614)
- SF 2240 Allows for motorcycles that have been modified to be equipped with detachable stabilizing wheels on the rear of the motorcycles to operate on Iowa's roads. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2246 Specifies that the definition of business trade trucks applies to model year 2010 and newer trucks. Allows for parents to get a persons with disability placard for a child under the age of one without supplying a social security number. (Senate Calendar) (Similar to HSB 695 on House Calendar)
- SF 2273 States that it is the intent of the legislature to create an electronic motor vehicle registration and titling program by January 12, 2012, and requires the Department of Transportation to submit a study on implementation of the program to the Legislature by December 1, 2010. (Senate Calendar)
- SSB 3070 Makes it illegal to write or send a text. Violation is a scheduled fine of \$30; warning will be issued for first year. (Senate Calendar) (Similar to HF 2021)
